WARMBLOOD IDENTIFICATION REGISTER

1. The Warmblood Identification (W.I.D.) Register records all male and female horses which are not eligible for the AWHA Stud Book but which can demonstrate a minimum of 25% of recognised Warmblood breeding in their pedigree, irrespective of what the other components of the pedigree may be.
2. The WID is a non-breeding Register.
3. Horses need not be of solid colour (bay, black, brown, chestnut, grey). Diluted and broken coat colours/patterns are acceptable.
4. Horses cannot generally be upgraded from the Identification Register to the Stud Book, but females with acceptable breeding, colour and height may be eligible for classification into the Warmblood Foundation Mare (WFM) Register at three years of age (see Info Sheet: *WFM Register*).
5. The female progeny of mares that remain in the Identification Register may also be eligible for consideration for inclusion in the WFM Register subject to satisfying the associated pedigree, colour, classification and height requirements.

Male progeny from Identification Register mares, however, are not eligible for Colt Selection. They remain in the Identification Register and should not be used for breeding. The same applies to mares which do not meet the minimum classification score of 60%.
