



AWWA Code of Conduct – For Officials

In addition to the AWWA Ltd General Code of Conduct, the following requirements are imposed on AWWA Ltd Officials during any activity held or sanctioned by the AWWA:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others
- Be fair, equitable, considerate and honest in all dealing with others
- Use facilities and equipment for their proper purposes and care for and maintain such facilities and equipment correctly
- Refrain from anything which may abuse, intimidate or harass others
- Provide a safe environment for AWWA events
- Place the safety and welfare of riders, competitors or participants above all else
- Abide by the principles of the AWWA Ltd Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse
- Maintain a 'duty of care' towards others and an accountability for matters relating to AWWA events
- Accept responsibility for all actions taken
- Be impartial
- Avoid any situation which may lead to a conflict of interest
- Be courteous, respectful and open to discussion and interaction
- When representing the AWWA, act and dress at all times in a manner appropriate to the position of an AWWA official
- Preserve and protect the standing and reputation of the AWWA, inclusive of not disclosing any information that is marked AWWA Confidential outside of the audience it was intended for or, the unauthorised use of AWWA Intellectual Property.
